

Calling All Cursillistas

The *Cursillo* focuses on showing Christian lay people how to become effective Christian leaders over the course of a three-day weekend. The weekend includes fifteen talks, some given by priests and some by lay people. The major emphasis of the weekend is to ask participants to take what they have learned back into the world, on what is known as the "fourth day." The method stresses personal spiritual development, as accelerated by weekly group reunions (after the weekend).

The Morning Offering is meant to be prayed first thing in the morning, upon waking up. In its simplest form, a morning offering is nothing more than a brief prayer that recognizes the presence of God, and puts the day ahead in his hands.

The traditional Morning Offering to the Sacred Heart of Jesus was composed by Fr Francois-Xavier Gautrelet in 1844. It reflects the *Alliance of the Hearts of Jesus and Mary* and is also an act of reparation.

O Jesus, through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer you my prayers, works joys, sufferings of this day, in union with the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass throughout the world, I offer them for all the intentions of your Sacred Heart; the salvation of souls, the reparation for sin, the reunion of all Christians; I offer them for the intentions of our bishops and of all members of the Apostleship of Prayer, and in particular for those recommended by the Holy Father this month.
